Guest Lecture on Rorschach's Inkblot Test (RIBT)

The guest lecture was delivered by Mr. Jini Gopinath, Consultant Clinical Psychologist at Mind Matters, Bangalore and Guest Faculty of Psychology at IIPR on the 31st of August, 2017. The lecture began with recapitulating and discussing the history of Rorschach's Inkblot Test and its subsequent development in 1921. The rationale of using this projective test was discussed, as it is deemed to be an important psychodiagnostic tool which gives an explanation to the oddities observed in the patient's behaviour. The guest lecture dealt with the procedures, and scoring system of Rorschach thereby giving an in depth understanding to the students.

Guest Lecture on Behavioural Economics

A guest lecture on 'Behavioural Economics' was held on the 4th & 9th of November 2017 for the undergraduate students in the college campus. The lecture was given by Mr. Seshadri, MA, M.Phil, Retired Professor, Bangalore University, who briefed the students about how the subject 'Behavioural Economics' is more related to Psychology rather than Economics. He supported this fact by tracing the history of some great behavioural economists whose main areas of focus were Psychology, Sociology and even Political Science but had won awards for Economics. Guest Lectures

Through story-telling and interaction with the students, she gave them an idea about the conditions and the current problems. She further elaborated on why we need to know about various governmental service centers dedicated for homeless people and victims of various kinds of oppression. She gave a breakdown of the taxpayers money being used for upliftment and



development, and how the Nirbhaya fund had been used. Her talk was focused around urban safety and the legal rights young adults have in India. During the course of the lecture, the students were asked for suggestions in order improve the cities and urged them to take responsibility towards the same.

Ms George ended the lecture with introducing us to their website which has information about sexuality, sexual and reproductive health, legal rights and personal stories by readers. It opened up the minds of the young citizens of the country, and perhaps brought a change for the future of the world.
