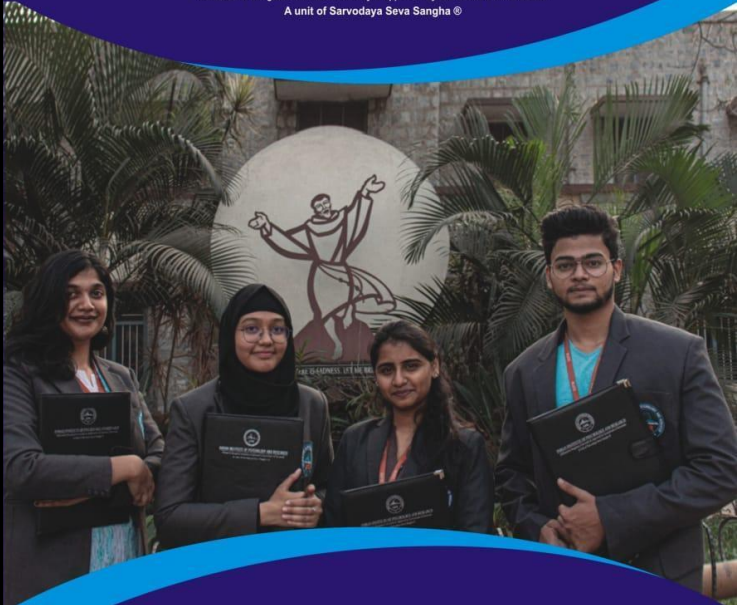

About Bengaluru City University (BCU)

Bengaluru City University (BCU) formerly known as Bangalore Central University is located in the Garden City of India, Bangalore. BCU is one among the trifurcated universities from the erstwhile Bangalore University, one of the oldest and largest universities in India. Bangalore University was established in July 1964 as an offshoot of the University of Mysore, primarily to include institutions of higher learning located in the Metropolitan City of Bangalore and the Districts of Kolar and Tumkur.

Bangalore City University (BCU) has a fruitful existence of four years under the eminent leadership of stalwarts with decades of administrative and educational expertise. BCU has come to be hailed as one of the most promising universities of Karnataka with over 250 affiliated colleges.

In 2015, The Karnataka Legislative Assembly passed the Karnataka State Universities Act, 2000 (Karnataka Act 29 of 2001) trifurcating Bangalore University into Bangalore University, Bengaluru City University, and Bengaluru North University. This trifurcation was made based on legislative assembly constituencies for a smoother administrative process. IIPR follows the prescribed curriculum based on National Education Policy

(NEP) started in the year 2020 and implemented from the academic year 2021-2022 for undergraduate courses.

Curriculum and Course Pattern

Being an affiliated college of BCU, IIPR follows the curriculum of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS Semester Scheme) in the Postgraduate Degree Programmes based on the guidelines of Bengaluru City University. PG courses are for 2 year, 4 semester duration.

Course pattern of Undergraduate courses (UG)

The curriculum of UG course comprises of the following 4 parts-

Part 1: Three core/major subjects (each paper 3 credits)

Part 2: Two language courses for the duration of 4 semesters (each paper 2 credits).

English, as a First Language is a mandatory course and for Second Language, students will be assigned the language that the student had studied in 10th/11th/12th grades. The list of second languages offered in college are- Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil, Malayalam and Additional English.

Part 3: FC/SDC Courses - One paper in each semester, for all 6 semesters (2 credit paper)

Part 4: Co-curricular activities (1 Credit Paper) - participation and position in the various co-curricular and extracurricular activities organized by the college

In the first four semesters the course offers 64 credits with 16 credits in each semester. In the last two semesters it will be 40 credits with 20 credits in 5th and 6th semester. Total of 104 credits will be awarded on successful completion of the 6 semester UG course.

A candidate who has passed two years Pre-University Examination conducted by the Pre-University Education Board in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to the undergraduate programmes as per the below guidelines-

The undergraduate degree is of four year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period. The four years multidisciplinary Bachelor's programme allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education with a focus on major and minor subjects as per the student's preference. The undergraduate programme extends over four academic years (Eight Semesters) with multiple entry and exit options.

Course pattern of Postgraduate courses (PG)

The curriculum of PG course comprises of the following 3 parts-

Part 1: Four Core Theory Papers (each paper 4 credits each)

Part 2: Two Practical Paper (each paper 4 credits each)

Part 3: One Soft-Core Paper during first two semesters (2 credits)

Core papers and practical papers in the first semester are foundation papers, from the second semester to fourth semester specialisation papers will be offered.

In the first two semesters the course offers 52 credits with 26 credits in each semester. In the last two semesters it will be 48 credits with 24 credits in 5th and 6th semester. Total of 100 credits will be awarded on successful completion of the 4 semester PG course.

The general features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

In CBCS each course carries a certain number of credits. Credits normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as the number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, maximum marks etc. Thus the relative importance of subjects of study is quantified in terms of credits.

The declaration of result is based on the Aggregate Percentage of marks obtained as well as on Aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned.

Credit system for Undergraduate Programmes:

- One to two hours of instruction per week in a semester is assigned one credit.
- In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 25 to 50 marks in a semester.
- On this basis, a three-year six-semester degree program will have 104 credits.
- The subjects of study include core subjects, language papers, foundation course/ skill development courses along with co-curricular activities.
- Multiple exit options(exist only after 2 semesters)-each semester 22-24 credits
- Certificate/ Diploma/ B.A.Degree/ Honours Degree
- Direct Enrollment to PhD after 4 years honours degree with research paper
- Masters degree only 1 year after honours degree.

Credit system for Postgraduate Programmes:

- 1 credit per hour of instructions in theory and 1 credit for 2 hours of practical/project work/ internship per week.
- In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 25 to 50 marks in a semester.
- On this basis, a two-year four-semester degree program will have 100 credits.
- The courses offered in the Master's degree program may be core, elective and soft core papers.

Eligibility

For Undergraduate Courses: -

- Minimum of 40% marks or equivalent in 10+2/PUC/12th Standard of a State/National or International Board approved by Bengaluru City University.
- Students from Science/Arts/Commerce stream are eligible.
- Students expecting PUC/12th results can apply with their 11th/ 1st PUC marks cards seeking Provisional Admission
- Students from NIOS (Open Schooling System) are also eligible to apply if separate marks sheets for 11th and 12th are available.
- Classification of Students on the basis of Examination Boards-
 - ❖ Student completing their course from Pre-University Board(PUC) of Karnataka will be eligible for Karnataka Quota and will be treated as Karnataka Student;
 - ❖ All other Indian examination boards including other state boards will be treated as Non Karnataka Quota/ Non Karnataka Students;
 - ❖ All the International Boards such as Cambridge and International Baccalaureate(IB) and students completing studies from any country other than India will be treated as NRI / Foreign Board Studies. Their eligibility needs to be approved by the university separately.

For Postgraduate Courses: -

- Candidates who have completed graduation with Psychology as a major subject only are eligible to apply.
- M.Sc. Psychology Course: - Minimum 40% marks in the aggregate of all the Optional Subjects in three years of Under graduation, with Psychology as one of the subjects and having scored aggregate 50% marks in the same.
- M.Sc. Psychological Counselling Course: - Candidates with 50% marks in the aggregate of B.A./B.Sc./B.Ed./PG Diploma in Counselling with at least one subject in Psychology or any paper/course related to Psychology.
- Students expecting results of their final semester/year of Undergraduate course can apply with their previous semester/year marks cards seeking Provisional Admission.
- Students from Non-Psychology Background /Distance Education /Open University/ Online Graduate Courses are NOT eligible.

Duration of the Programmes

For Undergraduate Programmes:

- Six Semesters (three academic years) for the regular Bachelor's Degree.
- Each semester shall consist of at least 16 weeks of study with a minimum of 90 working days. (Excluding the time spent for the conduct of the final examination of each semester).
- The successful completion of the three years of the Undergraduate programmes would lead to a Bachelor's Degree in the Subjects.

For Postgraduate Programmes:

- Four Semesters (two academic years) of 16 weeks or more with a minimum of 90 actual working days of instructions in each semester.
- The successful completion of the second year of the Postgraduate programmes would lead to a Master's Degree in the Subjects.

Attendance Requirements for all the Courses

- Each subject (theory and practical respectively) is treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance
- A student shall attend a minimum of 75 % total instruction hours in each subject.
- There is no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and any student who fails to secure 75% attendance in any paper in a semester shall be required to repeat that entire semester with all the papers.
- Shortage of attendance in multiple papers will lead to the student being detained for the semester and would be required to repeat the semester.
- Medical Leaves and Contingency Leaves are accepted if authentic documents and letters are submitted to the Class Teachers/Mentors/ Coordinator as per the protocol, i.e. submitting the supporting documents to the class teacher by the student, immediately upon their joining back college after the leave claimed.
- The claim will be acknowledged if and only if the student has an attendance percentage close to the university prescribed minimum and has reported on the reopening day of each semester.
- A maximum of 15days medical leave will be sanctioned for genuine medical reasons at the discretion of the principal, if the student is found to be regular and punctual to classes otherwise.

Criteria to Pass

- A candidate has to obtain a minimum of 35% marks in written examination and 40% marks in the aggregate of written examination and internal assessment put together in each of the subjects, 40% marks in practical examination (in subjects with practicals) and 40% marks in project work & viva wherever prescribed.
- A candidate is declared to have passed if he/she secures at least a CGPA of 4 in the aggregate of marks for both Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations respectively.
- Candidates who fail in a lower semester examination may go to the higher semesters and take the re-examinations.

Internal Assessment (IA)

The internal assessment marks allotted are based on the performance of students in Written Assignments/ Tests, Activity Based Assignments such as- field assignment, project, seminar, discussion, role plays, record work, Attendance percentage and performance in the Pre-final examinations. There will be 2 components with 2 criteria each for IA.

Teaching Pedagogy

Classroom teaching by professionally qualified and experienced faculty are supplemented with debates, discussions, activities, assignments and innovative evaluation strategies. The college encourages students to obtain a sound theoretical knowledge in addition to a hands-on experience by engaging in internships and field visits.

Internship

Postgraduate and Undergraduate Students are recommended to undertake internships under the guidance of faculty supervisors in addition to their course work, so that they get hands-on training in skills required at the workplace.

Students can opt to choose hospitals, counselling centres, clinics, organisations/MNCs, NGOs etc., based on the field of specialisation the student is interested in. On completion of the internship the student has to produce the certificate of attendance from the concerned authorities along with a report of the nature of work carried out and submit them for verification to their internship supervisor. The report should provide a comprehensive coverage of case histories/case study, assessments and observations made at the internship site. Successful completion of internship by students under subject faculty supervision will be certified by the college.

Field Work/Field Visits/Extension Activities

IIPR arranges various Field Work/Field Visits/Extension Activities to centres identified and recommended by the team of teaching staff. The field work is intended to be an eye-opener to students about the problems and challenges faced by people in different walks of life. The field visits are also designed to help the students apply the theoretical knowledge gained in classrooms by way of organising seminars, awareness drives, psychosocial education and short workshops etc., at the site of visit.

Value Added Programmes offered by IIPR

In addition to the prescribed curriculum of Bengaluru City University, IIPR offers additional papers and value addition programmes to the interested advanced learners to optimise their potential. On the other hand bridge courses, remedial programmes and student assistance programmes are offered to those who require additional personal attention. These additional programmes make IIPR one of its kinds in the whole country.

Certificate Courses offered by IIPR

The certificate programmes are offered to both students and the general public. The duration of these courses is 3 – 6 months. The course will be held in evenings of weekdays/ weekends depending on the availability of the resource person and convenience participants. The pedagogy used for training includes- lecture classes, workshops, field visits, group discussions, role plays, presentation of assignments by students etc. On successful completion of the course requirements specified, certificates will be awarded.

These courses are offered by the institute to interested students, practitioners and professionals from different walks of life meeting the required eligibility criteria mentioned for each of the courses. The duration of the course is generally 3 – 6 months, which would include contact classes, online classes, assignments and project work, supervised internship, assessment and evaluation. 5. IIPR CAMPUS

The campus of IIPR at Madiwala, Koramangala has the conducive ambience for learning and state-of-the-art infrastructure facilities that create a favourable environment for gaining knowledge and understanding. Classrooms: Spacious and well-ventilated classrooms with multimedia facilities.

Psychology Laboratory: The psychology laboratory is well equipped with instruments, assessment tools and other materials for practical classes and for all forms of psychological assessment.

Computer Laboratory: Laptops with internet facilities are provided for student use. These could be used for project works, research works and assignments.

Auditorium: The College uses auditorium/hall facilities available in the campus and adequate arrangements are made around the open space and quadrangle to host common college programmes. The auditorium is used by the students and staff for conducting special programs, ceremonies and events.

Seminar Hall: IIPR houses a state of the art seminar hall within the campus, called ‘Taala Auditorium’ which is equipped with the latest technology and multimedia facilities. The seminar hall has the capacity to accommodate 70 students and is used for organising various seminars, symposiums etc.

Audio and Video Lab: Journalism students have access to fully equipped audio and video studios situated within the campus near Taala Auditorium, which can be used for projects, assignments and various extra-curricular activities.

Canteen: The IIPR Canteen named ‘**Seeker’s Café**’ caters to the needs of students in providing quality and nutritious food at affordable prices. The aesthetically designed canteen is a favourite place for students to take a refreshing break.

Library: The students of IIPR have access to a library which is well equipped with journals, magazines, textbooks, reference books, and a vast collection of E-books and E-resources. In addition to course related books the library caters to the needs of students by making available books on current affairs, general knowledge, fiction, philosophy etc. The College Library remains open from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm from Monday to Friday, and from 8:00 am to 2 pm on Saturdays.

Stationery & Photocopying Centre: Stationery shop caters to urgent stationery requirements of students and also offers photocopying facilities. It is housed within the college office.

Church & Prayer Hall: IIPR being located within the church premises has prayer halls, chapel and church for those who wish to spend time in silent reflection and prayer.

Parking Facility: Along with easy accessibility, the highlight of the campus is the ample and attractive parking area. Students and staff can use vehicles to commute to college and can enjoy the vast parking space. The college campus being a place for learners, the sprawling parking spots in the campus gives plenty of room for students to park their vehicles easily.

Specific Guidelines for Parking Facility usage:

1. IIPR Parking Premises are available only from 8 am to 6 pm, in-case any student wants to leave the vehicle overnight due to unavoidable circumstances, they need to inform the IIPR office and leave the key in the office.
2. Parking facilities are available only for the vehicles with parking stickers. Contact IIPR reception for the registration form and stickers.
3. All the four wheelers and two wheelers should be parked in the specified IIPR parking zone near IIPR block 2 only.
4. No vehicle is permitted to be parked in any other place (in front of Friary/Parish office/ UG Block/Cafe) than the specified places. Parking in other areas will result in the vehicle being locked/towed away.

Student Welfare Office (SWO)

The Student Welfare office functions for the well-rounded holistic growth of the students of IIPR by facilitating Co-Curricular and Extra Curricular Activities. The SWO is a platform meant for the purpose of fostering leadership skills, teamwork, event management, experiential learning and promoting physical and psychological well-being of our students. It also creates a conducive environment for students to bring forth any issues or concerns they may have at an academic or personal front.

Teacher coordinators are appointed as Student Welfare Officers. The SWOs execute various activities and programmes along with the elected representatives of the student body who constitute the student council.

Student Council: In order to encourage Student participation in college functioning, student representatives from the various courses are elected and nominated to the Student Council. The Student Council coordinates the organising of the various co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities, monitors the conduct and discipline of the students in campus, handles issues related to student grievances etc.

The members of the student council are organised into various committees such as, ECAC, DMC, DRC, GRC under the guidance of the office bearers to facilitate the smooth functioning and execution of various activities.

The various services offered by the Student Welfare Office are highlighted below:

1. ***Extra-Curricular Activities:*** The College provides students with various opportunities to take part in different extracurricular activities like Sports, Cultural and Literary Events in addition to conferences, seminars and workshops, etc. Students are expected and encouraged to participate in different activities.
2. ***Peer Mentoring Services:*** Selected students are nominated as peer mentors to support academic and non-academic endeavours. Fellow students may approach them if they have any issues or concerns related to adjustment at college.
3. ***Student Grievance Redressal:*** In the event that any student has a grievance of any nature, they are free to approach the Student Welfare Office. All efforts shall be made to redress the grievance in a satisfactory manner.
4. ***Feedback and Suggestion System:*** Students are provided with the facility to provide valuable and objective feedback and suggestions to the management and staff of the College to facilitate better learning and growth opportunities for the student and to aid IIPR in transforming itself into a centre recognized for its quality education system. The Suggestion Box placed in the Student Welfare Office could be used for the above mentioned purpose.
5. ***Anti-Ragging Cell:*** The Anti-Ragging Cell ensures that no incidents of ragging or bullying in any manner or form occurs in the college. Student representatives along with the Faculty members strive to promote a positive environment of mutual trust and respect.

6. ***Prevention of Sexual Harassment:*** Aims to promote and foster a positive interaction through mutual respect, understanding, respect and professionalism between genders free from all forms of violence, harassment, exploitation, discrimination and intimidation. It aims to tackle the issues related to student grievances if any. It organises awareness campaigns and arranges guest lectures on topics of contemporary relevance.
7. ***First Aid Facility:*** The health centre provides first aid facilities and medical attention to students in case of a medical emergency. Provision for rest during some forms of ailments is also provided. In cases where required, Doctor on call service is also provided.

Other Services and Facilities

1. ***IIPR Centre for Counselling:*** The counselling centre of the institute offers services to the students as well as to the general public. The counselling centre provides psychosocial intervention and various services such as aptitude test, career counselling, child and adolescent counselling, family and marital counselling, workplace counselling, etc. of an emotional or psychological nature and wish to seek counselling for the same.

2. ***Placement Cell:*** IIPR provides students career guidance from time to time helping them explore and understand the various avenues and opportunities available to them upon completion of the course. The objectives of the Placement Cell are:

- To help students be aware of the latest trends in different disciplines in the field of Psychology.
- To make students know and understand the different possibilities for their further studies.
- To encourage students to perform well and to have a greater scope in terms of job opportunities.
- To provide students with a platform to start their professional careers.

Payment of Course Fee, Financial Aid and Scholarships

Course fee has to be paid by all students prior to the commencement of the semester during every academic year without fail. Course fee remains the same during every academic year. IIPR does not collect any capitation fee, donation, fixed deposit or the like. Students who have financial contingencies can seek part payment options with an application and the same may be sanctioned at the discretion of the principal.

On the other hand, IIPR strives to offer educational opportunities to a large group of deserving students, particularly from the socioeconomically disadvantaged strata of society. The Institute awards scholarships and fee concessions to eligible students after assessing the needs of each student. In addition, the college ensures that eligible students receive the benefits of all the facilities, assistance and welfare schemes provided by the government of India from time to time.

The following grants and fee concessions are offered to students:

- Karnataka Minorities Students Scholarship
- SC/ST Scholarship
- SC/ST Fee Concession
- Low Income Students Fee Concession
- Sarvodaya Seva Sangha (SSS) approved Fee Concession
- IIPR Merit Scholarships for Meritorious Academic Performance.

The above mentioned scholarships/fee concessions will be given to students based on merit and will be reviewed each year based on the student's performance during the academic year.

6. GUIDELINES FOR THE STUDENTS

The following are the guidelines to be adhered to by the student body during their tenure at IIPR.

Code of Conduct

IIPR trusts and respects the individuality, maturity, and integrity of each student pursuing higher education at the institute. The students are expected to abide by these specific guidelines

General

- It is mandatory for students to carry their ID cards along with them and wear it when it is required.
- Use of college blazers is mandatory during occasions, events, fests, and conferences.
- Students are expected to keep the campus clean, hygienic, and green.
- Damage to college property (including scribbling on desks and benches), lab materials, library books, college desktops, college laptops, sports equipment, projectors, speakers, and audio equipment would account for strict disciplinary actions and/or fine by the management.
- Students will at all times behave in a respectful and congenial manner with their teachers, staff and friends. If any incidence of destructive behaviour towards college property or people, inappropriate language being used by the student, disrespectful tone of addressing the institution, management, teachers and fellow mates is seen, the same may lead to suspension of the student and in extreme cases rustication. The Principal and management reserve the right to punish/ reprimand the student in these circumstances after thorough investigation.
- Publishing or passing any information or derogatory statements against the college, management, faculty/visiting faculty or student body on social media or other platforms will be strictly dealt with.
- Oppression of any individual/community/ethnic minority groups will not be tolerated in any form. Students found engaging in such activities

will have to face severe consequences.

- IIPR has a policy of zero tolerance for ragging and bullying fellow students in any manner or form. In case a student(s) indulges in the same, the college reserves the rightful authority to rusticate the student or accord alternative action as stipulated by the Anti Ragging Bill.

In Campus

- Students are expected to maintain decorum and respect the college sanctity and precincts.
- Use of restricted areas within the campus (e.g., Friary seminary, quadrangle, terrace, and grotto) is strictly discouraged.
- Smoking, alcohol or drugs of any kind (except prescribed medical drugs) is strictly prohibited within the campus.
- Outsiders accompanying the students should be restricted to the cafeteria only. Parents are allowed in case of general visits/emergency/enquiry.
- Acts of physical intimacy should be strictly avoided on campus, cafeteria, and classrooms.

In Classroom

- Unnecessary disruption of classes by students will be dealt with strict disciplinary action.
- In the event that there is a situational urgency or emergency, students are expected to take permission of the faculty present in the class to make any form of announcement or to excuse themselves from the classroom.
- Students are expected to maintain decorum especially during free hours in order to avoid any disturbance to other classes and to their surroundings.
- In case of an emergency, the students may take the permission of the faculty present in the class to attend to or take/make a call outside the

classroom premises.

- Students are expected to maintain decorum in the examination hall. Any form of disturbing behaviour found during the examination would lead to rustication of the student from the exam.**In Library and Laboratory**
- Students are expected to maintain silence and decorum in the library to promote purposeful learning of the course.
- Books that are borrowed from the library must be kept carefully and should not be damaged in any way. Students should return or reissue the books borrowed by them on the date mentioned. All books must be returned to the library on the last working day of each semester.
- Lab Materials are to be used by students within the Laboratory only. Under no conditions should any material be taken out of the Lab premises, by any student. In the case of any damage caused to the Lab material, the student responsible is liable to replace the same.

Use of Internet and Electronic Devices

- Mobile phones and other electronic devices: Use of mobile phones or listening to music during class hours is strictly prohibited. In such cases, the present faculty member has the right to confiscate the phone for a period of one month along with the sim/memory card.
- Use of Internet/Wi-Fi Services provided by the College should be restricted to academic and literary purposes only. Strict action will be taken against any student noted to be misusing facilities provided by the Institute.
- Use of laptops or other devices during class hours for other assignment purposes is strictly prohibited. In such cases, the present faculty member has the right to confiscate the device/gadget.

Dress Code

It is expected that the students be dressed in an appropriate and modest way as demanded by any formal educational institute. The students are expected to abide by these specifications:

- Students are to attend college in semi formals and not in dishevelled attire when inside the campus.
- Students, both boys and girls note that within college your attire should not be above knee level at all times.
- Students are expected to wear clothes which are not provocative, transparent, and which does not invite undue attention from others.
- Students when in college campus are representatives of their college and hence are to be dressed smart and should not come across as unkempt.
- Use of flip flops is discouraged on campus.
- The Discipline committee is authorised to make note and give feedback, report to teachers regarding any non-adherence to dress code by students.

Safety Measures

- Students are requested to strictly follow the COVID safety measures in order to prevent and avoid spreading of the same.
- Students are requested to follow safety measures in order to avoid mishaps or negative consequences.
- Students are required to be vigilant of any unusual, suspicious or untoward behaviours or activities in the campus and report it immediately to concerned faculty or staff.
- Students should be careful and maintain speed limits while riding/driving any vehicle.
- Speeding of any vehicle or performing stunts with the vehicles within the college campus is strictly prohibited.
